THE DRIVER'S SEAT

Reflecting on 2024, it has been an eventful year! The membership numbers in the Hill Country Region (HCR) steadily increased each month, and HCR remained one of the busiest regions in PCA Zone 5. Additionally, 2024 marked an election year, with a transition of leadership scheduled for January 1, 2025.

I am honored to have been given the opportunity to serve as HCR's President for the 2025-2026 term. Alongside me will be Vice President Kent Ketterman, Secretary Gordie Robbins, and Treasurer Andrew Garcia. We stand ready to build upon the remarkable achievements of those who came before us and look forward to serving HCR and you, its members.

Reminiscing on the past year, HCR organized an impressive range of activities in 2024. Under the leadership of Social Chair Andrew Garcia, the social team hosted regular events like Informal GetTogethers, Ladies' Luncheons, and Happy Hours, together with special events such as Mozart's Cars, Coffee & Croissants, Wine Socials, and the annual Holiday Party. In total, the social team delivered approximately 140 social events, thanks to our dedicated volunteers!

The 2024 driving team, led by Driving Chair Ken Kalin, had a busy schedule as well. They organized 5 driving tours, including a Bluebonnet tour and a unique tour that combined both paved and unpaved routes. In addition, they hosted 2 High-Performance Driving Events at the Circuit of the Americas (COTA), a PCA Club Race, 2 Autocross events, and a Tire Rack Street Survival Session.

In April 2024, HCR partnered with the Maverick Region to host the 2nd Annual "Pick-Yer-Tour" weekend in Kerrville, TX. Co-Chair Gordie Robbins led the HCR team. The event attracted 200 cars and over 300 attendees who participated in technical, leisure, and paved/unpaved driving tours. A highlight of the weekend was the now infamous "Dirty Porsche Contest."

The Tech Session team, led by Kent Ketterman, partnered with HCR advertisers to offer 13 informative tech sessions. Participants gained valuable insights into Porsche vehicle maintenance and repair. 3 of these sessions were held at Porsche Austin, our biggest supporter, for which we are very grateful.

HCR's Community Service team, led by Chair Kent Ketterman, remained committed to giving back. In 2024, they organized 6 events with local charities, including the Texas Burn Survivors Society and the Texas Ramps Project. At the 2024 annual Holiday Party, HCR members donated over 100 new toys to the "Austin Police Operation Blue Santa" program and raised thousands of dollars for charity through our annual raffle and silent auction.

HCR enhanced its communication strategy by focusing on its underutilized social media platforms to engage current members and attract younger ones. Under the guidance of Social Media Coordinator Arsh Khaira, HCR's online presence grew through





its established platforms, including Instagram, Facebook, Discord, and YouTube. By mid-December 2024, HCR had reached 2,200 followers on Facebook and 1,800 on Instagram. Additionally, HCR's YouTube channel began featuring volunteer-produced, professional videos showcasing new and past HCR events, providing entertainment for members and the general public.

HRC's media presence was enhanced in 2024 with the new appointment of an Advertising Coordinator. Member Don Dominick volunteered to take on the responsibilities of maintaining relationships with current HCR advertisers, seeking new advertisers and sponsorships, and creating a media packet.

HCR's Horizons newsletter, nationally recognized and award-winning, underwent a leadership change in 2024 with member Joe Cunningham volunteering as the new Editor. Despite the transition, the quality of the newsletter's articles and photos remains high, and members can also access it digitally on our website at www.hcrpca.org

Speaking of our website, the HCR web team, consisting of Edward Doan and Max Silvestri, demonstrated their competitive spirit by implementing several recommended changes to the website. Their efforts paid off and at the 2024 PCA Parade in Birmingham, AL, HCR was honored to receive the 2023 Class V Best Overall Website Award. Congratulations to Edward and Max!







COBB Tuning recently became an HCR advertiser and we are off to a great start with them. are probably already aware that COBB is also an advertiser with PCA National and has been for some time. In case you are not familiar with what COBB is all about, let me tell you a little bit about them. COBB has been in the business of tuning cars since 1999 and hence are celebrating their 25th anniversary this year! COBB got their start tuning Subarus but have expanded to include several other brands in their offerings, including Porsche. Simply put, the staff at COBB has the skill and resources to remap a car's Engine Control Unit (ECU) to improve the performance of our cars. There is more horsepower and more torque available from a Porsche engine than exists when we receive the car from the factory. COBB knows how to unleash the hidden performance by replacing conservative factory ECU settings with more aggressive calibrations. To go just one step deeper, the remapping primarily adjusts ignition timing, fuel delivery and turbo boost pressure.











COBB claims a 69 HP and 124 torque increase in a base Carrera 991.2 for example. If tweaking the ECU isn't enough for you, COBB also manufactures and sells aftermarket performance parts to improve air induction, exhaust flow and engine cooling. You can go big or go small with COBB, it all depends on what you are looking to do.

Now let me tell you a little bit more about COBB Tuning. Each first Thursday of the month, COBB holds an event at their Austin HQ. First Thursday gives attendees the chance to see cars, talk about cars, learn more about COBB, eat some food and socialize with fellow enthusiasts. On August 1, COBB held a Porsche focused event for us to celebrate our new relationship with them. The event was attended by nearly 50 HCR members and included a tech/dyno demonstration of a Porsche 718 Cayman GTS. Porsche Club members have an open invitation to attend First Thursday and keep an eye out for future events with COBB.



GRUPPECHAT AT TOP NOTCH





My new role is that of Immediate Past President who remains on the EC. The main objective of this role is to provide advice and continuity to the new Team.



Likewise, Carl was informed that at the end of 2024, volunteer George Hansen would be stepping down as HCR's Treasurer and


